



“Protestant Orphan Asylum.” Formally organized in 1851. In 1853 the two city blocks bounded by Haight, Herman, Laguna and Buchanan Streets were bought at public sale. In March 1854 the first building on this site was occupied. In 1863, with money donated by the Sansome Hook and Ladder Co. and the proceeds from the sale of a lot of ground given by Mr. James Lick, the addition was built known as the Sansome Wing. The building was raised in 1919.

INDENTURE OF GIRL.

This Indenture, Made the Eighteenth (18) day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventy (70) BETWEEN Mr Sen B. Rankin President, and Mr Frederic Mc Cullish Secretary, of the SAN FRANCISCO ORPHAN ASYLUM SOCIETY, of the City and County of San Francisco, with the consent of Elizabeth Haley an orphan, under the care of said Society, of the one part, and Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr of the City of San Francisco State of California of the other part:

WHEREAS, under the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act to authorize the Board of Managers of the San Francisco Orphan Asylum Society, or any other Orphan Asylum Society in this State, to bind as apprentices, clerks and servants, orphan and half orphan children under their care and tuition," approved February 23d, 1860, the Board of Managers of the San Francisco Orphan Asylum Society did on the Fifth (5) day of August 1869 pass the following resolution, viz:

WHEREAS, Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr of the same City of San Francisco, have been applied to this Board to take as an apprentice the girl Elizabeth Haley it is therefore Resolved that the said girl be indentured to said applicant, and that the President and Secretary of this Society be, and are hereby authorized to execute the necessary and proper papers for that purpose.

NOW THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH, That the said Mr Sen B. Rankin President, and the said Mr Frederic Mc Cullish Secretary of the said San Francisco Orphan Asylum Society, by virtue of said Act, and of said Resolution, do hereby bind and place the said Elizabeth Haley of the age of Thirteen (13) to be an apprentice with said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr and with them to dwell, serve and continue from the date of these presents until the said Elizabeth Haley shall attain the age of Eighteen (18) years, which will be on the First (1) day of January in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and Seventy (70) during all of which time, the said Elizabeth Haley shall serve the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr well and faithfully, in all such lawful and respectable business as may be required of her, and to the extent of her strength and ability, and the said Elizabeth Haley of her own free will consents to be bound as aforesaid, and hereby promises to fulfil her part of the contract, and in all things to be truthful, honest and obedient.

And the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr covenant and agree to and with the said Mr Sen B. Rankin President, and the said Mr Frederic Mc Cullish Secretary of the said Society, and their successors in office, that they will teach and instruct the said Elizabeth Haley after the best manner that the trade or occupation of _____ can be taught, by affording her an opportunity of acquiring a thorough knowledge of said business in all its branches. And the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr further promise and bind themselves to provide said apprentice with good and sufficient food, comfortable lodging, proper washing, and suitable apparel for working and holidays, and all other things necessary, fit and convenient for said apprentice during the term aforesaid.

AND IT IS FURTHER COVENANTED AND AGREED by and between the parties to this Indenture; that said apprentice shall, at all times have liberty to communicate freely with the Board of Managers of said Society. And the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr further promise that they will semi-annually communicate verbally, or in writing as may be most convenient, with said Society, informing them of the health, condition, and improvement of said apprentice.

That written notice shall immediately be given to the Board of Managers of said Society, should the apprentice leave service before the expiration of the term.

That the said apprentice shall not be transferred to the service of any other person, nor this Indenture assigned without the written consent of the Board of Managers of said Society.

That if at any time during the term of this Indenture, it shall be satisfactorily shown to the Board of Managers of said Society, that the foregoing conditions of this Indenture have not been complied with, by said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr or that said apprentice is cruelly treated, or has been placed to serve in any Restaurant, Boarding House, Hotel, Theatre, or any other establishment where spirituous liquors are sold; or employed in any place or manner whereby her moral character may be endangered, then this contract shall be annulled, and the said Society shall have power to reclaim and take back said apprentice.

That upon the expiration of the term, the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr shall pay to the said apprentice, the sum of One hundred & seventy (170) dollars, and provide her with two good suits of clothing.

That this Indenture shall terminate on the death of the said Mr & Mrs Nicholas Carr during said term.
